Constitution clause 18 (e)

Failure to Pay: If a member has not paid the subscription on or before the due date of March 1st or has not entered into an arrangement either under Rule 17 (d) or Rule 18 (d) on or before the due date, then the Member shall forfeit all rights of Membership and all privileges of the Club until the subscription and all arrears or penalties have been paid.

Flexible Payment Option

The club offers a flexible payment option under Rule 18(d), where members can make a minimum 20% deposit and then make regular weekly, fortnightly or monthly payments to spread the balance.

GUIDELINES FOR PLAYING TIMES

Women

LGU and Championships (based on handicap index) Silver: 0 – 18.4, Bronze A: 18.5 – 28.4, Bronze B: 28.5 – 40.4

Please arrive before 8.30am every Tuesday except May, June, July and August when you need to arrive by 9am. Saturday women can play from 9am in the usual time slot or have your name entered on the DotGolf start sheet for later in the day.

9 Hole Players

Arrive for competitions on a Tuesday before 9.30am except May, June, July and August when you need to arrive before 10am.

Men

Book Saturday starting times through Dot Golf. Championship & Medal Grades (based on course handicap) Senior: +6 – 9, Intermediate: 10 – 15, Junior A: 16 – 21, Junior B: 22 – 36

DRESS CODE ON THE GOLF COURSE

The following items cannot be worn on the golf course: singlets, T-shirts with offensive writing, swim shorts, jandles, and a game cannot be played in bare feet.

DRESS CODE IN THE CLUB ROOMS

The dress code requires no shoes with sprigs, bare feet, singlets or T-shirts with offensive writing be worn in the club rooms. Members are to remove headwear when they enter the club rooms, unless they have medical, cultural or religious reasons for not doing so.

COURSE ETIQUETTE

Please repair your pitch marks and divots and take a sand bucket with you every time you play. Score cards must be taken every time you play on the course with a partner.

DIGITAL SCORECARDS

Digital scorecards can be used for social games. However printed cards must be used for Kaiapoi sanctioned competitions.

Players must have a Golf NZ Handicap to play in the competition.

PLAYER RESPONSIBILITIES

Using the Handicap Index and the Course Handicap

A Golf NZ Handicap is a number issued by a golf Club that represents the potential scoring ability of a player on a course of standard difficulty. The Golf NZ Handicap Index is expressed as a number to one decimal place that is updated daily. For example: a Golf NZ Handicap Index of 16.2 would be converted to a Course Handicap of 17 at a course with a slope rating of 120, using the Course Handicap Table. When you use the DotGolf kiosk to print a personalised card your Course Handicap will be calculated automatically and printed on the card.

Handicap System

The DotGolf system prints out your scorecard automatically.

The system provides for a score for any hole to be reduced to a specific number of strokes over par for handicap purposes as follows:

Handicap Stroke

No Handicap stroke on hole 1 Handicap stroke on hole 2 Handicap strokes on hole

Limitation on Hole Score

Limit of two over Par Limit of three over Par Limit of four over Par

Scores returned for rounds of 13 Holes or more may be used for handicapping purposes. 9 hole scores may also be used for handicapping purposes.

Golf Competitions and How They Are Played

Match Play:

The lowest number of strokes played wins the hole.

Par:

Win-Lose-Draw the hole.

Ambrose:

This is played in teams of two, three or four, to a set percentage of the team's combined course handicap.

Individual Games

Gross / Nett Medal:

Players gross or nett score is used.

Stableford:

A player scores 1 point for a nett bogey, 2 points for a nett par, 3 points for a nett birdie, 4 points for a nett eagle. Once no points can be achieved on a hole the player can pick up.

Par (or Bogey):

A player has a minus (-) for a nett bogey or worse, a half (0) for a nett par or a plus (+) for a nett birdie or better. Plus and minus scores are taken from one another to give a final result. Strokes are taken on the holes on which they occur.

Bisque Par (or Bisque Bogey):

Same as above except a player may take their strokes where they want to until the handicap is used up. Multiple strokes can be taken on a hole. Strokes taken need to be tabulated on the scorecard to record the number of shots used. Strokes used must be decided before teeing off on the next hole.

Pairs Games

4 Ball Best Ball:

The best score on each hole between the pair is counted. This can be a best gross, stableford or nett depending on the competition on the day.

Canadian:

Each player tees off. The best ball is chosen and alternate shots are played until the ball is in the hole. This game can be a gross, stableford or nett depending on the competition on the day. The players are given 40% of their combined handicap.

Greensome: A Pairs Game

Each player tees off and plays a second shot. After which the best ball is chosen and alternate shots are played until the ball is in the hole. This game can be gross, stableford or nett depending on the competition on the day. The players are given 40% of their combined handicap.

American Greensome: A Pairs Game

Each player tees off and swap balls to play a second shot. After which the best ball is chosen and alternate shots are played until the ball is in the hole. This game can be gross, stableford or nett depending on the competition on the day. The players are given 40% of their combined handicap.

Foursome: A Pairs Game

One player tees off the odd number holes and the other player tees off the even numbered holes. Alternate shots are played until the ball is in the hole. This game can be gross, stableford or nett depending on the competition on the day. The players are given 50% of their combined handicap.

Irish / African Stableford:

Stableford points for the players are multiplied together on each hole.

Irish Stableford: 4 Person Team

Allows the best of three stableford points to be recorded for the first 6 holes then the best two scores from holes 7-12 and finally all four scores from the last 6 holes

2 Person Ambrose:

Each player tees off, the best ball is chosen and each player hits from that position. This format continues until the ball is in the hole. This game is generally a nett game. The players are given 25% of their combined handicaps calculated to 0.1. Each player must use seven tee shots, one of which must be on a par 3. The other 4 holes are free.

Team Events

Teams Stableford:

All 4 players play their normal game. The best 3 out of the 4 stableford scores are added together on each hole. If there are teams of 3 included, then those teams have a 'ghost' player who scores 2 stableford points on each hole. The ghost players score can only be used if one of the other three do not score any stableford points.

4 Person Ambrose:

Each player tees off, the best ball is chosen. The player whose ball is chosen does NOT play the next shot, but the other 3 play from that position. This format continues until the ball is holed out. Four tee shots of each player must be used leaving two free holes. One of each players tee shots must be on a par 3. The players are given 12.5% (one eighth) of their combined handicaps calculated to 0.1. This game is generally a nett game.

On the Course

All visitors and members are expected to carry a bucket of sand to repair all their divots. Please repair all pitch marks and divots and leave all trundlers and carts at the sides of all teeing grounds.

Please play ready golf, except in match play when the person with the honour tees off first. Move smartly between shots. Please avoid slow play and allow following groups through.

Hole-in-one

- 1. The aim of the fund is to reimburse members for reasonable out of pocket expenses incurred, up to a maximum of \$250, when celebrating the perfect shot in the traditional manner, but only on the day on which the hole-in-one occurred.
- 2. If a member gets a hole in one and:
 - (a) They produce a correctly completed card applicable to go in the competition on that day and it is a competition set up under the control of the Club.
 - (b) During any Open Tournament.
 - (c) During any Interclub match.
 - (d) During any programmed Veteran's event.
 - They can claim the \$250 hole-in-one reimbursement.
- 3. Disbursement of the fund must be approved by two members of the Playing Committee when the event takes place at the Kaiapoi Golf Club and may be approved by the Club Administrator when the event happens at any other golf course.

Members are only eligible if conditions 2 and 3 are met.

PLEASE GIVE WAY TO GREENKEEPERS

Policy Decisions

These policies are reviewed annually at the first Board meeting of each year or as required.

- To represent Kaiapoi Golf Club in any Canterbury Golf Interclub Competition, members must have paid a Membership fee on or before 1st March in the current year that provides them with full playing rights (eg Full Active, Secondary, etc), unless spread payment arrangements have been made with the Club Administrator. 9 Hole Members are only eligible to compete in CGI 9 Hole Interclub Competitions. Juniors are eligible to play in any Interclub competition.
- Smoking is permitted on veranda areas in keeping with the Smokefree Environment Act.
- Any member who defaults or pulls out of a Club Match Play or Interclub Competition without reasonable cause approved by the Playing Committee will not be considered for similar competitions in the following year.
- The Board generally meets every month. Agenda items close five days prior to the meeting.
- Children under the age of 12 years shall not be permitted on the course at any time on a competition day unless they hold an official Golf NZ Handicap.
- Children under the age of 12 shall be permitted on the golf course when:
 - 1. They are under the instruction of a Golf Professional.
 - 2. They are under the instruction of a Club nominated Golf Tutor or parent or adult.
 - 3. Pre-school children are not allowed on the course at any time.
- Dogs are not allowed on the course at any time even if they are on a leash.
- All visitors, playing with a member, are entitled to a discount off the standard green fee that would usually apply to them a \$5 discount for 18 holes, a \$3 discount for 9 holes. The discount only applies to one visitor per member in the playing group.
- Visitors playing in club competitions are subject to the standard green fee charges, plus the competition entry fee, except where the visitor is playing in an organised event approved by the Club that sets a different entry or playing fee.
- Playing groups are not to exceed four people at any time, except with express permission of the official starter of the day, where common sense will be exercised.

Representative Honours

When any member of the Kaiapoi Golf Club, except a Secondary member, is selected to represent Canterbury in any officially recognised competition, the Club will recognise their selection with the appropriate donation of money and or memorabilia to a value not exceeding \$50 if the competition is to be held in the South Island or not exceeding \$100 if the competition is to be held in the North Island.

When any member of the Kaiapoi Golf Club, except a Secondary member, is selected to represent New Zealand in any officially recognised competition, the Club will recognise their selection with an appropriate donation of money and or Memorabilia to be decided by the Playing Committee.

Course Closure

Any two of the following Club personnel – Board Member, Club Captain, Greens Superintendent, after consultation with each other, have the power to close the course.

Course

All fixtures held at the Kaiapoi Golf Club must use starting tees as determined by the competition organiser or the official starter of the day. If not directed otherwise, players should start off #1 tee.

Check Club noticeboard, website or programme book for tournament bookings.

Golf rules and etiquette always apply.

Local rules are on the scorecard and displayed by the starter's box.

Placing

When permitted, a ball lying on any "in the general area through the green" may be lifted, cleaned and placed within 15cm of where it originally lay, but not closer to the hole. After the ball has been so placed, it is in play.

Competitions

Members must be paid up fully to the starter of the day before going out on the course, if entering any competitions such as game of the day, two's or birdies.

Pitch Marks, Divots and Bunkers

If the course is to be kept in good order it is essential that all players should co-operate to see that pitch marks on greens, divots on the fairways and holes in the bunkers are repaired. Sand buckets should be carried at all times.

Golf Carts

- Drive in the rough on frost delay starts
- Follow the instructions on cart window screen
- Don't park or stop in front of a green
- Don't drive on tee blocks

If you see any questionable behaviour please speak to the driver, as looking after the course and Club carts is to the benefit of all Kaiapoi members.

Please do not leave your trundler, bag or cart in front of the green, instead position it on the way to the next tee.

Golf Terminology Simplified

Aiming: It's the act of aligning the clubface to the target that the golfer intends his/her ball to go to.

Address: When a golfer adjusts their stance and positions themself relative to the ball and begins the preswing routine.

Alignment: The position of a golfer's body in relation to the target of the ball.

Ace (hole-in-one): Getting the ball into the hole with only one shot.

Albatross: A hole played three shots under par.

Balance: It is the right distribution of golfer's weight at address and throughout the swing.

Ball Marker: Any small object used to mark where a player's ball is on the green. Some golfers use a coin.

Back Nine: Holes 10 through 18 on a golf course.

Baseball Grip: A golf term known as the "Ten-Finger Grip", a style of grip where all the ten fingers are placed on the club.

Birdie: A hole played one stroke under par.

Bogey: A hole played one stroke over par.

Closed Stance: Describe a posture of a golfer when his/her rear foot is pulling back away from the target line.

Caddie: A person paid to carry a player's clubs and offer advice.

Cart:1) Electrical vehicle used to transport players from hole to hole. 2) Hand-pulled cart to carry a bag of clubs (usually has a wheels).

Casual Water: Snow and ice can be taken as casual water, as well as water that over flows the banks of existing water hazards.

Chip: It's a short shot which travel through the air over a very short distance and roll the rest of the way to the hole. This shot is usually played from extremely close to and around the green.

Chunk (Fat) or Thin (Skinny): A chunk, or hitting "fat," occurs when the club strikes the ground before making contact with the ball, causing a large divot and a shot that falls short of the target. On the other hand, a "thin" or "skinny" shot is made when the lower part of the clubface connects with the ball, resulting in a longer-thannormal distance.

Clubface: The angled surface of the golf club head that is used to hit the ball. The centre of the clubface is known as the "sweet spot". To maximize distance and accuracy players should hit the ball with the centre of the clubface.

Clubhouse: The clubhouse is the golfer source for information about local rules, the conditions of the course and other essential information for the avid golfers.

Generally, golfer can also purchase balls, clubs and other golfing equipment at the clubhouse.

Course Rating: Course rating is used when calculating your golf handicap. It's an evaluation of how hard a specific course should play for a scratch golfer (0 handicap).

Divot: It is a notch (chunk of grass) caused by club head hitting the ground several inches before the ball. It is also called a pitch mark. Players must repair their pitch marks, usually with a tee or a divot tool.

Dogleg: A hole that's crooked like the "hind leg of a dog." Typically, the hole is straight for your tee shot but bends to the left or the right for your approach shot.

Double Bogey: A hole played two strokes over par.

Double Eagle (or Albatross): A hole played three strokes under par.

Duff: Golf slang for a bad shot. One that you mis-hit and didn't go as intended.

Eagle: A hole played in two strokes under par.

Explosion: A golf terms also known as "a blast"...explosion is a shot from a bunker that sends the ball, accompanying with sand, onto the green.

Fairway: The short grass on the hole between the tee and the green.

Fairway bunker: Usually located in a recessed depression it is a hazard of sand or bare earth. Grass or wooden walls are not part of the hazard.

Fore: "Fore!" this golf terms is shouted as a warning when it appears possible that a ball may hit other players or spectators.

Free Drop: A rule that allows you to take relief without a penalty stroke. For example, if your ball is on a path you get a "free drop".

Fringe: The fringe is a slightly higher-cut area of grass encircling the green.

Front Nine: Holes 1 through 9 on a golf course.

Gimmee Putt: A gimme putt is a short putt that your opponent in a match play competition allows you to skip, considering it as a made putt. Gimmee's should only be given in match play competitions.

Green (or putting green): The area of specially prepared grass around the hole, where putts are played.

Grounding the club: To place, at address, the clubface behind the ball on the ground. Grounding the club is forbidden in bunkers.

Ground Under Repair (GUR): An area of the golf course that is being repaired.

Handicap: A handicap measures the average number of strokes above par during a round, allowing players of different skill levels to compete against each other.

Hazard or Penalty Area: Physical part of the course such as water traps or red staked areas where it is hard to play the ball. You can try to play from these areas without penalty, but it is often smarter to take a one shot penalty and drop out of the area.

Hook: A hook affects right-handed golfers by curving the ball from right to left in the air. This type of shot can create additional distance due to the topspin but can also be problematic in the form of a duck-hook. A less severe hook is known as a draw or a push-draw.

Interlocking grip: Grip style where the pinkie finger of the right hand is hooked around the index finger of the left. It is usually used by right-handed players.

Lie: The ground that the ball is resting on. The golf terms "Good lies" include the fairway and the green, while bunkers, pine straw, and the rough are examples of "bad lies".

Line: The expected path of the ball to get into the hole. Golfer must never "Step in a player's line" on the green.

Links: A course on the ocean, usually devoid of trees and therefore windy courses beside the sea (they were the link between the beach and the farmland). Many courses in the United Kingdom are links.

Lip-out: When your ball hits the hole but doesn't go in. It curls around the cup or "lips out".

Long Game: A term that relates to hitting long shots with clubs like the driver, woods or long irons.

Lost Ball: When you cannot find your ball. You must take a penalty and replay your shot from where you hit it.

Match Play: A type of competition where you play an opponent to win holes. Your total score doesn't matter, just how many holes you win.

Medal play: This golf term is also known as "stroke play"... a style of scoring in which the player with the fewest strokes wins. The stroke play is played in most professional tournaments.

Open Face: When you twist the clubface to add loft to the club. An open face might be used when playing from a greenside bunker.

Out of Bounds: When you hit your shot out of the course or, in the case of Internal Out of Bounds, you hit your shot outside an area marked by white stakes. You have to take a "stroke and distance" penalty, i.e. add a shot to the number of shots you have had and replay the shot.

Pin: Another name for the flagstick.

Provisional Ball: If you hit a ball that may be out of bounds or hard to find, you can hit a "provisional" ball. If you don't then continue with your original ball you can play the provisional ball with an appropriate penalty.

Putt: A putt is when you use your putter on the green. The objective is to have as few putts as possible and can be measured on a per-round basis.

Range Finder: A device that measures the distance you are from the hole.

Rough: The rough is the longest grass around the course, making shots from it more difficult. Depending on the course, the rough length can vary significantly, and there may be intermediate and deep roughs present.

Scratch: A "scratch" golfer has a handicap of zero and typically plays at or below par.

Shank: The shank, also known as "The S Word," is a golfer's nightmare. It occurs when the ball is hit off the neck or heel of the club, sending the shot sharply to the right. Shanks are considered contagious, so be careful not to mention them out loud!

Short Game: A term for chipping and putting.

Short-sided: Being short-sided means hitting an approach shot to the same side of the green where the pin is located, making chips or pitches more difficult.

Slice: A common issue for amateur golfers, a slice causes the ball to curve from left to right in the air. This excessive sidespin results in a shorter overall shot distance. A milder version is called a cut or a pull-cut.

Slope Rating: Slope measures a golf course's difficulty for amateur players and can range from 55 to 155, with higher numbers being more challenging.

Stableford: A type of competition in which points are awarded depending on how you play the hole in relation to your handicap.

Stroke Play: The standard format used when playing golf where you count every shot that you make and the lowest score (usually after deducting your handicap) wins.

Tee box: A tee box is where you take your tee shot at the beginning of each hole. Always tee your ball behind the markers to avoid a one-shot penalty.

Topped shot: A topped shot happens when the bottom of the club strikes the top half of the ball, leading to a disappointing shot that only travels a few metres.

Triple Bogey: A hole played three strokes over par.

Up and Down: When you chip on to the green and one putt.

Yips: A dreaded golfing affliction, the yips result from muscle spasms or mental blocks that hinder a golfer's ability to perform basic tasks. This issue mostly affects putting, often causing jerky swing motions.

Professional Golfer Amelia Garvey

Amelia Garvey is currently competing to make the European Tour 2025

GARVEY AND BOUVET FINISH TIED AT THE TOP AT ROTANA

Amelia Garvey fired an excellent final round of 65 (-7) which included two eagles to finish in a share of first place at the Pre-Qualifier held at Golf Club Rotana.

The New Zealander began the third day in a share of sixth place but had a great finish to her prequalifying campaign in Morocco.

Garvey made an eagle on the second hole with birdies on the seventh and 10th before she recorded another eagle on the 13th and finished in style with birdies on holes 14, 15 and 18 to end the week with a total of nine-under-par.

"I've found the pre-qualifier great," said Garvey. "The course has been set up very well and I've been able to take advantage of my length especially on par-5s by taking on some aggressive lines off tees.

"The eagles were both good, I hit driver, 5-iron into both the second and 12th to about 20-foot and holed the putt. I played really solidly all day. It was stress-free which was really nice knowing that I was comfortably inside the cut line, so I wanted to go and test myself and go low in preparation for next week.

"I came to LET Q-School because I have had three years on the Epson Tour now and not been able to make it to the LPGA that way, so I was looking for a change of scenery. My family is originally from England and my cousin Jamie tipper, who is caddying for me this week, has caddied a fair bit on LET and said that he thinks I would like the Tour and that the courses would suit me, so I just wanted to give it a go.

"I'm feeling great heading into next week especially, after today's round. It has been nice to compete again this week after about five weeks off in prep for final stage. However, that is behind me now and I'm looking forward to seeing the two new courses we will be playing and getting a little bit of rest tomorrow."

Garvey finished tied at the top of the leaderboard alongside French amateur Vanessa Bouvet who carded a 69 (-3) on the final day.

The 25-year-old had six birdies on her scorecard, as well as a double bogey and a bogey, to finish on nine-under-par.

"My golf game today was pretty solid again; however, I did have a bit of a poor finish going out of bounds on 17 and into the hazard on 18 trying to force a couple shots," said Bouvet.

"My caddy and I were again really on point with club selection for approaches. However, I thought that the course played a little tougher today with the wind and with harder pin positions. I think the best part of my game was putting as I made a lot of putts today, especially to save par.

"It feels pretty good to make it through the final stage and I'm really excited for the challenges to come and to get that LET card! I think coming in with the same mentality of playing with no fear, focusing and committing to every shot is how I will prepare for next week."
